## The Japanese Language School Archival Project

In the Spring of 2000, the Archives continued the original efforts of Captain Roger Pineau and William Hudson. and the Archives first attempts in 1992, to gather the papers, correspondence, photographs, and records of graduates of the US Navy Japanese Language School, University of Colorado at Boulder, 1942-1946. We assemble these papers in recognition of the contributions made by JLS graduates to the War effort in the Pacific, the successful occupation of Japan, the creation of Japanese language programs across the country, and the development of cultural reconciliation programs after World War II.

## Reunion Attractions

### **Rec Center Access**

The CU Recreation Center, run by student fees, one of the largest and most modern athletic/recreation facilities in the country, will provide access to JLS/OLS Reunion attendees at visitor prices (\$5/day). The facility includes swimming pools, tennis courts, a track, exercise machines, weights, various indoor courts, saunas, and spacious locker rooms and shower facilities. # Free Passes for Local Buses

The Archives has arranged with "Go-Boulder" to provide 100 free passes for the *Hop, Skip,* and *Jump*, local circulators in Boulder. The *Hop* circles from Campus to Pearl Street to the shopping mall at Crossroads. The *Skip* runs back and forth on Broadway, and the *Jump* runs up and down Arapahoe. We will try to give these free tickets to those most in need of local transportation.

### JLS/OLS Film Festival

The Archives is arranging with the East Asian Languages and Civilizations Department and the Center for Asian Studies to put on a Film Festival for the Reunion. Already listed for the Festival is Tora, Tora, Tora. Also planned are showings of: the 1999 Newshour interview with JLS graduates; Uncommon Courage, a film on the MIS Nisei; The Marianas at War, a 3 part documentary on the Marianas Islands which includes JLO interviews; plus old standbyes like Midway and Marine Ranger. The movies will be shown in the new Eaton Humanities Building, free of charge.

Thursday and Friday evening, a "gathering place" will be located at the University Club. JLS grads and their kin can meet other reunion attendees. Liquid refreshments will be available and Big Band music will be played for the patrons. We felt that The University Club could serve as a place to congregate.
